2 Chronicles 10:1-19 **Foolishness of Rehoboam – Divided Kingdom**

The Revolt Against Rehoboam (1 Kings 12:1-19)

- 1 And Rehoboam went to Shechem, for all Israel had gone to Shechem to make him king.
- ² So it happened, when Jeroboam the son of Nebat heard it (he was in Egypt, where he had fled from the presence of King Solomon), that Jeroboam returned from Egypt.
- 3 Then they sent for him and called him. And Jeroboam and all Israel came and spoke to Rehoboam, saying,
- ⁴ "Your father made our yoke heavy; now therefore, lighten the burdensome service of your father and his heavy yoke which he put on us, and we will serve you."
- ⁵ So he said to them, "Come back to me after three days." And the people departed.
- 6 Then King Rehoboam consulted the elders who stood before his father Solomon while he still lived, saying, "How do you advise me to answer these people?"
- ⁷ And they spoke to him, saying, "If you are kind to these people, and please them, and speak good words to them, they will be your servants forever."
- 8 But he rejected the advice which the elders had given him, and consulted the young men who had grown up with him, who stood before him.
- 9 And he said to them, "What advice do you give? How should we answer this people who have spoken to me, saying, 'Lighten the yoke which your father put on us'?"
- 10 Then the young men who had grown up with him spoke to him, saying, "Thus you should speak to the people who have spoken to you, saying, 'Your father made our yoke heavy, but you make it lighter on us' thus you shall say to them: 'My little finger shall be thicker than my father's waist! And now, whereas my father put a heavy yoke on you, I will add to your yoke; my father chastised you with whips, but I will chastise you with scourges!'"
- 12 So Jeroboam and all the people came to Rehoboam on the third day, as the king had directed, saying, "Come back to me the third day."
- 13 Then the king answered them roughly. King Rehoboam rejected the advice of the elders, 14 and he spoke to them according to the advice of the young men, saying, "My father made your yoke heavy, but I will add to it; my father chastised you with whips, but I will chastise you with scourges!"
- 15 So the king did not listen to the people; for the turn of events was from Elohiym (God), that Yahweh (the Lord) might fulfill His word, which He had spoken by the hand of Ahijah the Shilonite to Jeroboam the son of Nebat.
- 16 Now when all Israel saw that the king did not listen to them, the people answered the king, saying:
- "What share have we in David? We have no inheritance in the son of Jesse. Every man to your tents, O Israel! Now see to your own house, O David!" So all Israel departed to their tents.

 17 But Rehoboam reigned over the children of Israel who dwelt in the cities of Judah.

- 18 Then King Rehoboam sent Hadoram, who was in charge of revenue; but the children of Israel stoned him with stones, and he died. Therefore King Rehoboam mounted his chariot in haste to flee to Jerusalem.
- 19 So Israel has been in rebellion against the house of David to this day. NKJV

Facts Revealed:

- ♦ Rehoboam went to Shechem where all Israel had gathered to make him king. [2 Chronicles 10:1]
- ♦ Jeroboam was an industrious mighty man of valor from the tribe of Ephraim whom Solomon appointed over the labor force of the house of Joseph. [1 Kings 11:26-28]
- ♦ When Jeroboam went out of Jerusalem he met the prophet Ahijah who spoke to him about God's intention to take ten tribes of the kingdom away from the son of Solomon because Solomon had turned to idolatry. [1 Kings 11:29-39]
- → Jeroboam rebelled against Solomon and fled to Egypt because Solomon sought to kill him.

 [1 Kings 11:40]
- ♦ When Jeroboam heard of the death of Solomon he returned to Israel. [2 Chronicles 10:2]
- ♦ The people of Israel called for Jeroboam and together they went to Rehoboam to request tax relief. Rehoboam told them to come back after three days for his answer. [2 Chronicles 10:3-5]
- ♦ Rehoboam asked the elders who had been with Solomon, and they advised him to listen to the people and they will serve you forever. [2 Chronicles 10:6-7]
- ♦ Rehoboam turned to the younger generation who had grown up in the lap of luxury, and they advised him to increase the burden on the people. [2 Chronicles 10:8-11]
- ♦ When the people came back on the third day, Rehoboam responded according to the advise of the selfish generation promising to increase their burden. [2 Chronicles 10:12-14]
- ♦ The turn of events was guided by Elohiym to fulfill His word spoken by the prophet Ahijah to remove ten tribes from the son of Solomon because Solomon had turned to idolatry when he was old. [2 Chronicles 10:15, 1 Kings 11:1-13]
 (Solomon was the wisest man ever on earth, but not wise enough to fully obey God as David his father had done). [Deuteronomy 17:14-20, 1 Kings 3:14]
- ♦ When the people heard Rehoboam's answer they rebelled and departed saying, "We have no part in the son of Jesse, now see to your own house O David. [2 Chronicles 10:16]
- ♦ Rehoboam was left to reign over the children of Israel who were in the cities of Judah. [2 Chronicles 10:17]
- ❖ King Rehoboam sent Hadoram, who was in charge of revenue; but the children of Israel stoned him with stones, and he died.
 Therefore King Rehoboam mounted his chariot in haste to flee from Shechem to Jerusalem. [2 Chronicles 10:18]
- ♦ The Northern tribes of Israel remained in rebellion against the house of David until this message was written. [2 Chronicles 10:19]
