

2 Samuel 14:1-33 **Absalom's strange return to Jerusalem**

Joab's craftiness

1 So Joab the son of Zeruah perceived that the king's heart was concerned about Absalom.

2 And Joab sent to Tekoa and brought from there a wise woman, and said to her, "Please pretend to be a mourner, and put on mourning apparel; do not anoint yourself with oil, but act like a woman who has been mourning a long time for the dead. 3 Go to the king and speak to him in this manner." So Joab put the words in her mouth.

4 And when the woman of Tekoa spoke to the king, she fell on her face to the ground and prostrated herself, and said, "Help, O king!"

5 Then the king said to her, "What troubles you?"

And she answered, "Indeed I am a widow, my husband is dead. 6 Now your maidservant had two sons; and the two fought with each other in the field, and there was no one to part them, but the one struck the other and killed him. 7 And now the whole family has risen up against your maidservant, and they said, 'Deliver him who struck his brother, that we may execute him for the life of his brother whom he killed; and we will destroy the heir also.' So they would extinguish my ember that is left, and leave to my husband neither name nor remnant on the earth."

8 Then the king said to the woman, "Go to your house, and I will give orders concerning you."

9 And the woman of Tekoa said to the king, "My lord, O king, let the iniquity be on me and on my father's house, and the king and his throne be guiltless."

10 So the king said, "Whoever says anything to you, bring him to me, and he shall not touch you anymore."

11 Then she said, "Please let the king remember the Lord your God, and do not permit the avenger of blood to destroy anymore, lest they destroy my son."

And he said, "As the Lord lives, not one hair of your son shall fall to the ground."

12 Therefore the woman said, "Please, let your maidservant speak another word to my lord the king."

And he said, "Say on."

13 So the woman said: "Why then have you schemed such a thing against the people of God? For the king speaks this thing as one who is guilty, in that the king does not bring his banished one home again. 14 For we will surely die and become like water spilled on the ground, which cannot be gathered up again. Yet God does not take away a life; but He devises means, so that His banished ones are not expelled from Him. 15 Now therefore, I have come to speak of this thing to my lord the king because the people have made me afraid. And your maidservant said, 'I will now speak to the king; it may be that the king will perform the request of his maidservant. 16 For the king will hear and deliver his maidservant from the hand of the man who would destroy me and my son together from the inheritance of God.' 17 Your maidservant said, 'The word of my lord the king will now be comforting; for as the angel of God, so is my lord the king in discerning good and evil. And may the Lord your God be with you.'"

18 Then the king answered and said to the woman, "Please do not hide from me anything that I ask you."

And the woman said, "Please, let my lord the king speak."

¹⁹ So the king said, "Is the hand of Joab with you in all this?" And the woman answered and said, "As you live, my lord the king, no one can turn to the right hand or to the left from anything that my lord the king has spoken. For your servant Joab commanded me, and he put all these words in the mouth of your maidservant. ²⁰ To bring about this change of affairs your servant Joab has done this thing; but my lord is wise, according to the wisdom of the angel of God, to know everything that is in the earth."

²¹ And the king said to Joab, "All right, I have granted this thing. Go therefore, bring back the young man Absalom."

²² Then Joab fell to the ground on his face and bowed himself, and thanked the king. And Joab said, "Today your servant knows that I have found favor in your sight, my lord, O king, in that the king has fulfilled the request of his servant." ²³ So Joab arose and went to Geshur, and brought Absalom to Jerusalem. ²⁴ And the king said, "Let him return to his own house, but do not let him see my face." So Absalom returned to his own house, but did not see the king's face.

²⁵ Now in all Israel there was no one who was praised as much as Absalom for his good looks. From the sole of his foot to the crown of his head there was no blemish in him. ²⁶ And when he cut the hair of his head — at the end of every year he cut it because it was heavy on him — when he cut it, he weighed the hair of his head at two hundred shekels according to the king's standard. ²⁷ To Absalom were born three sons, and one daughter whose name was Tamar. She was a woman of beautiful appearance.

²⁸ And Absalom dwelt two full years in Jerusalem, but did not see the king's face. ²⁹ Therefore Absalom sent for Joab, to send him to the king, but he would not come to him. And when he sent again the second time, he would not come. ³⁰ So he said to his servants, "See, Joab's field is near mine, and he has barley there; go and set it on fire." And Absalom's servants set the field on fire. ³¹ Then Joab arose and came to Absalom's house, and said to him, "Why have your servants set my field on fire?"

³² And Absalom answered Joab, "Look, I sent to you, saying, 'Come here, so that I may send you to the king, to say, "Why have I come from Geshur? It would be better for me to be there still.'" Now therefore, let me see the king's face; but if there is iniquity in me, let him execute me."

³³ So Joab went to the king and told him. And when he had called for Absalom, he came to the king and bowed himself on his face to the ground before the king. Then the king kissed Absalom.

Facts Revealed:

- ✧ Nathan had used a parable for the king to judge in order to bring king David to repentance. [2 Samuel 12:1-13]

Joab's craftiness [2 Samuel 14:1-24]

- ✧ Amnon raped Tamar the sister of Absalom, and Absalom waited 2 years to seek revenge while David the king did nothing about it. [2 Samuel 13:1-33]
- ✧ Absalom fled to his grandfather the king of Geshur where he stayed 3 years. [2 Samuel 13:34-38]
- ✧ David has a desire to go to Absalom but did not follow through with it. [2 Samuel 13:39]

- ✧ Joab used the tactic of Nathan and called for a woman of Tekoa to present a parable for the king to judge and request the return of Absalom the king's son, David asked if Joab was behind the visit and the woman confirmed it.. [2 Samuel 14:1-20]
- ✧ David authorized Joab to go to Geshur and bring Absalom back to Jerusalem, but forbid Absalom to see his face. [2 Samuel 14:21-24]

Absalom

- ✧ Now in all Israel there was no one who was praised as much as Absalom for his good looks. From the sole of his foot to the crown of his head there was no blemish in him. And when he cut the hair of his head — at the end of every year he cut it because it was heavy on him — when he cut it, he weighed the hair of his head at two hundred shekels according to the king's standard.
- ✧ To Absalom were born three sons, and one daughter whose name was Tamar. She was a woman of beautiful appearance. [2 Samuel 14:25-27]

Absalom in Jerusalem two years – not allowed to see David – The King kissed Absalom

[2 Samuel 14:28-33]

- ✧ Absalom waited to see his father for 2 years requesting to see David, before he burned Joab's field to get attention. [2 Samuel 14:28-32]
- ✧ Joab asked the king to allow Absalom to see his face, David authorized it and kissed his son. [2 Samuel 14:33]
 - ✧ David had 2 years to render justice for the rape of Tamar, and failed to do it.
 - ✧ David wanted to go to Absalom his son in exile, and failed to do it.
 - ✧ After 3 years in exile, David allowed his son to return to Jerusalem but refused to see him.
 - ✧ After 2 years in Jerusalem, Absalom is getting anxious because he is treated as an outcast.
 - ✧ This is a total of 7 years David has had opportunity to make things right in his own house, but failed to do so. All David did was to kiss his son, but there was no reconciliation in it.
 - ✧ Failure on David's part, bred resentment in the heart of his son Absalom, compounding the animosity in David's house in fulfillment of the words of Nathan the prophet. [2 Samuel 12:10-11]
 - ✧ When it came to his own house on this matter, David failed both as king and as father, his impulses were good, but his actions were pitiful.
