 - ♦ From Caesarea to shipwreck on Malta. [Acts 27:1-44]
 - ♦ Cold and wet shipwreck survivors receive unusually kind assistance from natives of Malta.
 - ♦ Malta is a small island in the Mediterranean Sea about 90 miles Southwest of Syracuse Sicily.

- ₽ But when Paul had gathered a bundle of sticks and laid them on the fire, a viper came out because of the heat, and fastened on his hand. - But he shook off the creature into the fire and suffered no harm. However, they were expecting that he would swell up or suddenly fall down dead. But after they had looked for a long time and saw no harm come to him, they changed their minds and said that he was a god. [Acts 28:5-6]
 - ♦ We are so likely to judge mistakenly when we look at circumstances and events.
 - ♦ At first impulse they assumed Justice had taken its course because Paul was a prisoner and the snake bit him even after he had escaped from the sea.

- ♦ Then when no harm came to Paul, they thought he was a god.
- ♦ This demonstrates the extremes of human perception and superstition when they do not know the truth.

 - ♦ The people of Malta were blessed by the miracles God had accomplished through the hands of Paul, and they responded by showing honor in many ways during the three months they were on the island. [Acts 28:10-11]
 - → They also provided the things the 276 people from the shipwreck needed for their journey on to Rome when they departed from Malta.
