Acts 4:32-37 Church Communal Living in Jerusalem

32 Now the multitude of those who believed were of one heart and one soul; neither did anyone say that any of the things he possessed was his own, but they had all things in common.

Power accompanying the witness of the Apostles

33 And with great power the apostles gave witness to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus. And great grace was upon them all.

All things Common

34 Nor was there anyone among them who lacked; for all who were possessors of lands or houses sold them, and brought the proceeds of the things that were sold, 35 and laid them at the apostles' feet; and they distributed to each as anyone had need.

Example of Barnabas

³⁶ And Joses, who was also named Barnabas by the apostles (which is translated Son of Encouragement), a Levite of the country of Cyprus, ³⁷ having land, sold it, and brought the money and laid it at the apostles' feet. NKJV

Facts Revealed:

- Unity of the Believers from the depths of their heart and soul Extended from Doctrine to care for each-other expressed by physical means. [Acts 2:42-43, 44-47, 4:32-37]
- ♣ Great power accompanied the Apostles' witness of the resurrection of Jesus. [Acts 2:43, 4:31, Mark 16:20]
- ♣ Great Grace was upon them all Sharing all things in common. [Acts 4:33, 35]
- Barnabas set the example by selling property he had on Cyprus and he laid the money at the Apostles feet. [Acts 4:36-37]
 - ♦ The name Barnabas (son of encouragement) was given to Joses by the Apostles. [Acts 4:36]
 - ♦ Barnabas (Joses) was a Levite of the country of Cyprus. [Acts 4:36]
- The Communal living was great at first, but not what God had in mind for the Church, so persecution began to attack the believers to scatter them around the world. [Acts 8:1]

 - ♦ Jesus wanted them to go around the world with the Gospel, not cluster in Jerusalem.
