## Deuteronomy 22:12 **TASSELS on corners of clothing**

12 "You shall make tassels on the four corners of the clothing with which you cover yourself. NKJV

Facts Revealed:

- Yehowah commanded Moses to have the Children of Israel make <u>tassels on the corners of</u> <u>their garments and to put a blue thread in the tassels</u>. [Numbers 15:37-41, Deuteronomy 22:12]
- ☆ The purpose of the tassels is to remind the Children of Israel to remember and do all the commandments of Yehowah so they will not follow harlotry which they are inclined to do. [Numbers 15:39]
- ⇔ By remembering to do all the commandments of Yehowah <u>they will be holy for Eloheykm</u> (their God). [Numbers 15:40]
- Yehowah said, "I am Yehowah Eloheykm (the Lord your God) who brought you out of the land of Egypt to be Eloheykm (your God). I am Yehowah Eloheykm (the Lord your God). [Numbers 15:41]
  - ♦ This statement of fact gives us all the authority of God and identifies the source as from the God Who brought the Children of Israel out of the land of Egypt by His own great power proving His supremacy over all that is called god.
  - ♦ There can be no higher authority. [Hebrews 6:13]
- ☆ Today, many so called Orthodox Jews refuse to put a blue thread in the corner of the garment for fear of having the wrong shade of blue.
  - $\diamond$  Is it wise to disobey a command of God just out of fear of having the wrong shade of blue?

## Numbers 15:37-41

37 Again the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, 38 "Speak to the children of Israel: Tell them to make tassels on the corners of their garments throughout their generations, and to put a blue thread in the tassels of the corners.

<sup>39</sup> And you shall have the tassel, that you may look upon it and remember all the commandments of the LORD and do them, and that you may not follow the harlotry to which your own heart and your own eyes are inclined, <sup>40</sup> and that you may remember and do all My commandments, and be holy for your God.

<sup>41</sup> I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, to be your God: I am the LORD your God." NKJV
