The Grief of Wisdom

- 12 I, the Preacher, was king over Israel in Jerusalem.
- ¹³ And I set my heart to seek and search out by wisdom concerning all that is done under heaven; this burdensome task Elohiym (God) has given to the sons of man, by which they may be exercised.
- ¹⁴ I have seen all the works that are done under the sun; and indeed, all *is* vanity and grasping for the wind.
- ¹⁵ What is crooked cannot be made straight, And what is lacking cannot be numbered.
- ¹⁶I communed with my heart, saying, "Look, I have attained greatness, and have gained more wisdom than all who were before me in Jerusalem. My heart has understood great wisdom and knowledge."
- ¹⁷ And I set my heart to know wisdom and to know madness and folly. I perceived that this also is grasping for the wind.
- ¹⁸ For in much wisdom is much grief, And he who increases knowledge increases sorrow.

Facts Revealed:

- ➡ I, the Preacher, was king over Israel in Jerusalem.

 And I set my heart to seek and search out by wisdom concerning all that is done under heaven; this burdensome task Elohiym (God) has given to the sons of man, by which they may be exercised. [Ecclesiastes 1:12-13]
 - ♦ Solomon described the extent of his search for wisdom.
 - ♦ He concluded that it was a burdensome task.
 - ♦ Elohiym has given all that is done under heaven to man to train and test him.
- ★ I have seen all the works that are done under the sun; and indeed, all is vanity and grasping for the wind.
 - What is crooked cannot be made straight, And what is lacking cannot be numbered. [Ecclesiastes 1:14-15]
 - ♦ Solomon considered all that is done by man as futile and grasping for empty satisfaction and the impossible.
 - ♦ He illustrated the concept by saying that what is crooked cannot be straightened and what is missing cannot be counted.
- ➡ I communed with my heart, saying, "Look, I have attained greatness, and have gained more wisdom than all who were before me in Jerusalem. My heart has understood great wisdom and knowledge." [Ecclesiastes 1:16]

- ♦ Solomon acknowledged his great accomplishments were far above all who had been kings in Jerusalem before him, which agrees with what God had promised. [2 Chronicles 1:7-12]
- And I set my heart to know wisdom and to know madness and folly. I perceived that this also is grasping for the wind.

For in much wisdom *is* much grief, And he who increases knowledge increases sorrow. [Ecclesiastes 1:17-18]

- ♦ Solomon chose to try everything including madness and folly to see by personal experience the results of it all.
- ♦ Thus in all experiences he kept his awareness and search for wisdom uppermost in his mind.
- ♦ He found it all to be futile and grasping for empty satisfaction.
- ♦ He concluded that with gaining much wisdom also brought much grief.
- ♦ Also gaining much knowledge brings much sorrow.
