The Vanity of Gain and Honor

⁸ If you see the oppression of the poor, and the violent perversion of justice and righteousness in a province, do not marvel at the matter; for high official watches over high official, and higher officials are over them.

⁹ Moreover the profit of the land is for all; *even* the king is served from the field.

¹⁰ He who loves silver will not be satisfied with silver; Nor he who loves abundance, with increase.

This also *is* vanity.

¹⁸ Here is what I have seen: *It is* good and fitting *for one* to eat and drink, and to enjoy the good of all his labor in which he toils under the sun all the days of his life which Elohiym (God) gives him; for it *is* his heritage.

¹⁹ As for every man to whom Elohiym (God) has given riches and wealth, and given him power to eat of it, to receive his heritage and rejoice in his labor - this *is* the gift of Elohiym (God).

²⁰ For he will not dwell unduly *on* the days of his life, because Elohiym (God) keeps *him* busy with the joy of his heart.

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Facts Revealed:

 - ♦ All levels of government are human, so it is not surprising when there is oppression and perversion of justice and righteousness in a province.
- ☆ Moreover the profit of the land is for all; even the king is served from the field. [Ecclesiastes 5:9]
 - \diamond The king is dependent on the produce of the field as is the servant.
- ✤ He who loves silver will not be satisfied with silver; Nor he who loves abundance, with increase.

This also *is* vanity. [Ecclesiastes 5:10]

- \diamond Love of silver and abundance is unsatisfying vanity.
- \diamond The apostle Paul also taught on this concept,

Now godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into *this* world, *and it is* certain^{*} we can carry nothing out. And having food and clothing, with these we shall be content. But those who desire to be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and *into* many foolish and harmful lusts which drown men in destruction and perdition. For the love of money is a root of all *kinds of* evil, for which some have strayed from the faith in their greediness, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows. [1 Timothy 6:6-10]

- \diamond Solomon continues to expand on the concept of vanity in love for silver and increase.
- ☆ There is a severe evil which I have seen under the sun: Riches kept for their owner to his hurt.

As he came from his mother's womb, naked shall he return, To go as he came; And he shall take nothing from his labor Which he may carry away in his hand.

And this also is a severe evil - Just exactly as he came, so shall he go.

And what profit has he who has labored for the wind?

All his days he also eats in darkness, And *he has* much sorrow and sickness and anger. [Ecclesiastes 5:13-17]

- \diamond Folly of striving for wealth is that it is temporary and will not last.
- \diamond You can take none of it with you at time of death.
- \diamond Naked he came into the world and naked he shall depart.
- \diamond The cost is greater than the value.
- Here is what I have seen: It is good and fitting for one to eat and drink, and to enjoy the good of all his labor in which he toils under the sun all the days of his life which Elohiym (God) gives him; for it is his heritage.

As for every man to whom Elohiym (God) has given riches and wealth, and given him power to eat of it, to receive his heritage and rejoice in his labor - this *is* the gift of Elohiym (God).

For he will not dwell unduly (undeservedly) *all* the days of his life, because Elohiym (God) keeps *him* busy with the joy of his heart. [Ecclesiastes 5:18-20]

It is enough to enjoy the fruit of your labor all the days of your life because it is the gift of Elohiym who gave it to you as a heritage to be gratefully received with rejoicing.
