1 For behold, the Lord, the Lord of hosts, Takes away from Jerusalem and from Judah;
The stock and the store,
The whole supply of bread and the whole supply of water;

2 The mighty man and the man of war,
The judge and the prophet,
And the diviner and the elder;

3 The captain of fifty and the honorable man,
The counselor and the skillful artisan,
And the expert enchanter.

4 "I will give children to be their princes, And babes shall rule over them.

5 The people will be oppressed, Every one by another and every one by his neighbor;
The child will be insolent toward the elder, And the base toward the honorable."

You be our ruler, And let these ruins be under your power,"

Facts Revealed:

Judgment against Judah and Jerusalem [Isaiah 3:1-9]

- ✧ Verses 1-3 perfectly describes the state of Jerusalem when the Babylonians besieged it and carried Jehoiachin, his family and officers to Babylon. [1 Kings 24:10-16, 2 Chronicles 36:9-10]
- ✧ Verses 4-7 may have been fulfilled when Nebuzaradan left some of the poor in the land to be vinedressers and farmers. [2 Kings 25:12]
- ✧ Verses 8-9 clearly indicate the cause of God's wrath is found in the speech and behavior of the people. Pride and arrogance in turning away from the commandments of God and going after the lusts of the flesh. They are proud of their debauchery and have become like Sodom and Gomorrah, openly flaunting their perverse preferences in public.
- ✧ Today the United States of America has followed the same path toward destruction from the President in the White House to the youngest children in the Public School system

where they are being conditioned to accept these perversions as natural, as directed by the National Education Association.
