The Lord Comforts Zion – A Kingdom Promise (cf. Genesis 12:1-3)

- ¹ "Listen to Me, you who follow after righteousness, You who seek the Lord: Look to the rock from which you were hewn, And to the hole of the pit from which you were dug.
- ² Look to Abraham your father, And to Sarah who bore you; For I called him alone, And blessed him and increased him."
- ³ For the Lord will comfort Zion, He will comfort all her waste places; He will make her wilderness like Eden, And her desert like the garden of the Lord; Joy and gladness will be found in it, Thanksgiving and the voice of melody.
- 4 "Listen to Me, My people; And give ear to Me, O My nation: For law will proceed from Me, And I will make My justice rest As a light of the peoples.

 - ❖ Looking back to the history of Israel, the writer desires Yahweh to take direct action on behalf of Israel like He did in the past instances described.

Yahweh assured Isaiah that He would indeed fulfill His promises to restore Israel

- ❖ So the ransomed of Yahweh (the Lord) shall return, And come to Zion with singing, With everlasting joy on their heads. They shall obtain joy and gladness; Sorrow and sighing shall flee away. Isaiah 51:11]
 - ♦ Yahweh repeats the promise of the redeemed returning to Zion rejoicing according to the message He gave earlier. [Isaiah 35:10]
- □ "I, even I, am He who comforts you. Who are you that you should be afraid Of a man who will die, And of the son of a man who will be made like grass?
 - And you forget Yahweh (the Lord) your Maker, Who stretched out the heavens And laid the foundations of the earth; You have feared continually every day Because of the fury of the oppressor, When he has prepared to destroy. And where is the fury of the oppressor? [Isaiah 51:12-13]
 - ❖ Yahweh identified Himself as the One Who comforts Israel and revealed that He is the Creator of Heaven and Earth.
 - ♦ Yahweh questioned Israel about their fear of mankind. [Psalm 3:6. Proverbs 29:25, Matthew 10:28, Luke 12:4-5, Hebrews 13:6]
 - ♦ Throughout history the human oppressors have all died off in the end.
 - ♦ Yahweh abides forever and has no end.

- ♦ Still the ones headed for captive exile spend much effort to protect themselves on their own rather than trusting in the salvation of God Most High.
- ⇒ But I am Yahweh Eloheyka (the Lord your God), Who divided the sea whose waves roared

 Yahweh Tsebavta (The Lord of hosts) is His name.

And I have put My words in your mouth; I have covered you with the shadow of My hand, That I may plant the heavens, Lay the foundations of the earth, And say to Zion, 'You are My people.'" [Isaiah 51:15-16]

- ♦ Yahweh reminded His people that His Name is Yahweh Tsebavta Who is the One Who
 made a road through the depths of the Sea when He divided the sea to bring Israel safely
 across in their departure from Egypt.
- ❖ Speaking of the Messiah, Yahweh indicated His guidance, protection, and mission from before Creation.
- ♦ Messiah spoke the message given to Him from on high, for the purpose of calling Israel back to Himself, so He can say to them, "You are My people."

God's Fury Removed

- ♦ Yahweh describes their condition to be like an antelope in a net, they are full of the fury of Yahweh. This judgment is the rebuke (reprimand) of their God.
- **☼** Therefore please hear this, you afflicted, And drunk but not with wine.
