## John 1:35-51 At John's Introduction – First Disciples Follow Jesus

- 35 Again, the next day, John stood with two of his disciples. 36 And looking at Jesus as He walked, he said, "Behold the Lamb of God!"
- 37 The two disciples heard him speak, and they followed Jesus. 38 Then Jesus turned, and seeing them following, said to them, "What do you seek?" They said to Him, "Rabbi" (which is to say, when translated, Teacher), "where are You staying?" 39 He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where He was staying, and remained with Him that day (now it was about the tenth hour).
- 40 One of the two who heard John speak, and followed Him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. 41 He first found his own brother Simon, and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated, the Christ). 42 And he brought him to Jesus. Now when Jesus looked at him, He said, "You are Simon the son of Jonah. You shall be called Cephas" (which is translated, A Stone).
- 43 The following day Jesus wanted to go to Galilee, and He found Philip and said to him, "Follow Me." 44 Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. 45 Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found Him of whom Moses in the law, and also the prophets, wrote-Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph."
- 46 And Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." 47 Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward Him, and said of him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom is no deceit!" 48 Nathanael said to Him, "How do You know me?" Jesus answered and said to him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you." 49 Nathanael answered and said to Him, "Rabbi, You are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" 50 Jesus answered and said to him, "Because I said to you, 'I saw you under the fig tree,' do you believe? You will see greater things than these." 51 And He said to him, "Most assuredly, I say to you, hereafter you shall see heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man." NKJV

## Facts Revealed:

- → John was baptizing at Bethabara, the ford of the Jordan River in the territory of Judea near Jericho. [John 1:28]
- ₱ Jesus had come from Nazareth of Galilee to John to be baptized in the Jordan River. [Matthew 3:13-17, Mark 1:9-11, Luke 3:21-22]
- After Jesus was baptized He went immediately to the wilderness where He was tempted after fasting 40 days. [Matthew 4:1-11, Mark 1:12-13, Luke 4:1-13]
- Apparently, from the text in John, Jesus returned to the area where John was baptizing and lingered a few days, so He could be identified by John as He walked by and was among the crowd. [John 1:26, 29, 35-51]
  - ♦ John first said, "There is One among you Whom you do not know." [John 1:26-27]
  - ♦ John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold the Lamb of God Who takes away the sin of the world! John then gave his testimony of the convincing evidence, and declared emphatically, "This is the Son of God." [John 1:29-34]
  - → John was looking at Jesus as He walked, and said, "Behold the Lamb of God!" [John 1:35-36]
- Two disciples of John heard John speak and followed Jesus, staying with Him the remainder of the day from the tenth hour. [John 1:37-39]

- ♦ One of the two who heard John speak and followed Jesus was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. [John 1:40]
- ♦ The other, because he is not named was most likely John the writer of the book of John, because John never names himself in his account of the Gospel.
- ♦ John and Andrew started out as disciples of John the Baptist.
- ♦ They called Jesus, "Rabbi" which is translated, "Teacher." [John 1:38]
- ♦ Andrew found his brother Simon ( whom is known in Scripture as Simon Peter) and brought him to Jesus saying, "We have found the Messiah," (Messiah is translated Christ).
  [John 1:40-41]
- ♦ Jesus demonstrated His omniscience as He expressed knowledge of the identity of Simon, son of Jonah, and Jesus at this time gave him the name Cephas (translated, A Stone). [John 1:42]
- ♦ Simon Peter is called Cephas six times in Scripture. [John 1:42, 1 Corinthians 1:12, 3:22, 9:5, 15:5, Galatians 2:9]
- The following day Jesus wanted to go to Galilee, and He found Philip and said to him, "Follow Me." [John 1:43]
  - ♦ Peter, Andrew, and Philip were from the town of Bethsaida, which was the eastern most of the three cities north of the Sea of Galilee where Jesus did most of His ministry. [John 1:44, Matthew 11:20-24, Luke 10:13-15]
  - ♦ The three cities of Galilee were <u>Capernaum</u>, <u>Chorazin</u> (Korazim), and <u>Bethsaida</u>.
  - ♦ Peter moved from Bethsaida to Capernaum where he had a house in which Jesus abode when He was in Capernaum. [Matthew 4:12-16, 8:5-17, 17:24-27, Mark 1:21-34, 2:1, 9:33, Luke 4:31-41]
  - ♦ Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found Him of whom Moses in the law, and also the prophets, wrote--Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." [John 1:45]
    - ☐ The reference of "**Him of whom Moses in the law and also the prophets, wrote**, is a reference to the prophet of Whom Moses had said, "The LORD your God will raise up for you a Prophet like me from your midst, from your brethren. Him you shall hear. [Deuteronomy 18:15]
    - ☐ Yehowah had said to Moses, "I will raise up for them a Prophet like you from among their brethren, and will put My words in His mouth, and He shall speak to them all that I command Him. And it shall be that whoever will not hear My words, which He speaks in My name, I will require it of him." [Deuteronomy 18:18-19]
  - ♦ Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." [John 1:46]
- ₱ Jesus again demonstrated His omniscience:
  - ♦ Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward Him, and said of him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom is no deceit!" [John 1:47] Jesus not only knew who Nathanael was but also knew his character to be free of deceit.
  - ♦ Nathanael said to Him, "How do You know me?" [John 1:48]
  - ♦ Jesus answered and said to him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you." [John 1:48]
  - ♦ That was enough evidence to convince Nathaniel that Jesus is indeed the Messiah, "Rabbi, You are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" [John 1:49]
  - ♦ Jesus promised Nathaniel that he would see much greater evidence than just the statement that Jesus had seen him under the fig tree before Philip called him. [John 1:50-51]
