John 5:1-16 Healing at the Pool of Bethesda by the Sheep Gate

Healing when the Waters Moved

¹ After this there was a feast of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. ² Now there is in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate a pool, which is called in Hebrew, Bethesda, having five porches. ³ In these lay a great multitude of sick people, blind, lame, paralyzed, waiting for the moving of the water. ⁴ For an angel went down at a certain time into the pool and stirred up the water; then whoever stepped in first, after the stirring of the water, was made well of whatever disease he had.

Thirty Eight Year Infirmity Healed on the Sabbath

⁵ Now a certain man was there who had an infirmity thirty-eight years. ⁶ When Jesus saw him lying there, and knew that he already had been in that condition a long time, He said to him, "Do you want to be made well?" ⁷ The sick man answered Him, "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; but while I am coming, another steps down before me." ⁸ Jesus said to him, "Rise, take up your bed and walk." ⁹ And immediately the man was made well, took up his bed, and walked. And that day was the Sabbath.

Who made you well?

¹⁰ The Jews therefore said to him who was cured, "It is the Sabbath; it is not lawful for you to carry your bed." ¹¹ He answered them, "He who made me well said to me, 'Take up your bed and walk.' " ¹² Then they asked him, "Who is the Man who said to you, 'Take up your bed and walk'?" ¹³ But the one who was healed did not know who it was, for Jesus had withdrawn, a multitude being in that place.

Sin no more lest a worse thing come upon you

¹⁴ Afterward Jesus found him in the temple, and said to him, "See, you have been made well. Sin no more, lest a worse thing come upon you." ¹⁵ The man departed and told the Jews that it was Jesus who had made him well.

Reason the Jews persecuted Jesus and sought to kill Him

¹⁶ For this reason the Jews persecuted Jesus, and sought to kill Him, because He had done these things on the Sabbath NKJV

Healing when the Waters Moved

- In Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate is the Pool of Bethesda, where an angel goes into the pool at a certain time and stirs the water, the first into the pool after it is stirred is healed of any disorder. [John 5:2-4]
 - ♦ Seven porches surround the pool where those who need healing gather to await the stirring of the water, the blind, lame, paralyzed etc, a great multitude.

Thirty Eight Year Infirmity Healed on the Sabbath

- ✤ A man who had an infirmity for thirty-eight years was there, but someone else always preceded him into the pool. [John 5:5-7]
 - ♦ Jesus saw him, and knowing that he had been in that condition a long time, Jesus asked him if he wanted to be healed. [John 5:6]
 - \Rightarrow He told Jesus he had no one to put him into the pool at the right time. [John 5:7]
 - ♦ Jesus said, "Rise, take up your bed and walk." [John 5:8]

☆ Immediately the man was made well, took up his bed, and walked. And that day was the Sabbath. [John 5:9]

Who made you well?

- The Jews therefore said to him who was cured, "It is the Sabbath; it is not lawful for you to carry your bed." [John 5:10]
 - ♦ He answered them, "He who made me well said to me, 'Take up your bed and walk.' " [John 5:11]
 - ☆ Then they asked him, "Who is the Man who said to you, 'Take up your bed and walk'?" [John 5:12]
 - ♦ But the one who was healed did not know who it was, for Jesus had withdrawn, a multitude being in that place. [John 5:13]

Sin no more lest a worse thing come upon you

- Jesus found him in the Temple and said, "See, you have been made well. Sin no more, lest a worse thing come upon you." [John 5:14]
 - ♦ After the Lord heals us of our infirmities, if we sin again, we are open for the oppression of a far greater problem. [John 5:13]
 - ☆ This command of Jesus, "Sin no more," is very important in our relationship with God, and future ailments. [John 5:14, 8:11]
- \diamond The man told the Jews that it was Jesus Who had made him well. [John 5:15] Reason the Jews persecuted Jesus and sought to kill Him
 - The Jews wanted to kill Jesus because Jesus had healed on the Sabbath. [John 5:16, Matthew 12:9-14, Mark 3:1-6, Luke 6:6-11]
