1 Then Jonah prayed to Yahweh Elohayv (the Lord his God) from the fish's belly.

³ For You cast me into the deep, Into the heart of the seas, And the floods surrounded me; All Your billows and Your waves passed over me.

⁵ The waters surrounded me, even to my soul; The deep closed around me; Weeds were wrapped around my head.

Facts Revealed:

Jonah's Prayer and God's Answer [Jonah 2:1-10]

- ♦ In the belly of the great fish Jonah had enough air to breath for three days and three nights at the bottom of the sea.
- ♦ Jonah was conscious of his surroundings and awake to pray to Yahweh.
- ♦ Jonah retained his faith in Yahweh and expected to again look toward His Holy Temple.
- ♦ Jonah acknowledged the foolishness of idolatry.
- \diamond Jonah vowed to bring his sacrifices to Yahweh with thanksgiving.
- ♦ Jonah acknowledged that Salvation is entirely God's doing.
