# Leviticus 6:14-23 Law of the Grain Offering

#### Grain Offerings of the people of the Children of Israel

14 'This is the law of the grain offering: The sons of Aaron shall offer it on the altar before the LORD. 15 He shall take from it his handful of the fine flour of the grain offering, with its oil, and all the frankincense which is on the grain offering, and shall burn it on the altar for a sweet aroma, as a memorial to the LORD. 16 And the remainder of it Aaron and his sons shall eat; with unleavened bread it shall be eaten in a holy place; in the court of the tabernacle of meeting they shall eat it. 17 It shall not be baked with leaven. I have given it as their portion of My offerings made by fire; it is most holy, like the sin offering and the trespass offering. 18 All the males among the children of Aaron may eat it. It shall be a statute forever in your generations concerning the offerings made by fire to the LORD. Everyone who touches them must be holy.' "

#### Grain Offering of the Priests

<sup>19</sup> And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, <sup>20</sup> "This is the offering of Aaron and his sons, which they shall offer to the LORD, beginning on the day when he is anointed: one-tenth of an ephah of fine flour as a daily grain offering, half of it in the morning and half of it at night. <sup>21</sup> It shall be made in a pan with oil. When it is mixed, you shall bring it in. The baked pieces of the grain offering you shall offer for a sweet aroma to the LORD. <sup>22</sup> The priest from among his sons, who is anointed in his place, shall offer it. It is a statute forever to the LORD. It shall be wholly burned. <sup>23</sup> For every grain offering for the priest shall be wholly burned. It shall not be eaten." NKJV

### Facts Revealed:

## Grain Offering for the people of the Children of Israel

- The "Law of the Grain Offering" refers to the duty of the priest with it.
- ☆ The Sons of Aaron shall offer it on the Altar before Yehowah.
- ✤ He will take his handful of the fine flour of the Grain Offering with its oil and all the frankincense that is brought with the Grain Offering and he shall burn it on the Altar for a sweet aroma, as a memorial to Yehowah.
- ☆ The rest of the Grain Offering belongs to Aaron and his sons the priests who shall eat it with unleavened bread in a holy place in the court of the Tabernacle of Meeting.
- $\Rightarrow$  It shall not be baked with leaven.
- $\Rightarrow$  It is the priests portion as God provides the inheritance for the priests.
- $\Rightarrow$  It is most holy like the Sin Offering and the Trespass Offering.
- $\Rightarrow$  All the males of the children of Aaron shall eat it.
- ✤ It is a statute forever throughout your generations concerning the offerings made by fire to Yehowah.
- $\Rightarrow$  Everyone who touches them must be holy.

## Grain Offering for the Priests of the Children of Israel

- ✤ From the day that the Priest is anointed, he shall offer to Yehowah one-tenth ephah of fine flour as a daily Grain Offering. Half of it is offered in the morning and half at night.
- $\Rightarrow$  It is made in a pan with oil when it is well mixed.
- ☆ The baked pieces of the Grain Offering the Priest shall offer for a sweet aroma to Yehowah, it is wholly burned.
- $\Rightarrow$  It is a statute forever to Yehowah.
- ☆ Every Grain Offering for the Priest shall be wholly burned, it shall not be eaten.
