How often I wanted to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, but you were not willing! ³⁵ See! Your house is left to you desolate; and assuredly, I say to you, you shall not see Me until the time comes when you say, 'Blessed is He who comes in the name of the LORD!' "NKJV

Facts Revealed:

- ♥ "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the one who kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to her! How often I wanted to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings, but you were not willing! 38 See! Your house is left to you desolate; 39 for I say to you, you shall see Me no more till you say, 'Blessed is He who comes in the name of the LORD!' "
 [Matthew 23:37-39, Luke 13:34-35]
 - ♦ Jesus desires to save mankind from Hell with all His heart.
 - ♦ Each individual must choose whether to accept His plea or reject it.
 - ♦ The consequence of rejecting the call is eternal condemnation and Hell Fire. Your house is left to you desolate [Matthew 23:38, Luke 13:35], how can you escape the condemnation of Hell? [Matthew 23:33, Mark 16:16]
 - ♦ It will be more tolerable on the day of Judgment for Sodom and Gomorrah than for those who refuse the Gospel of the Kingdom. [Matthew 10:14-15, 11:20-24, Mark 6:11, Luke 10:10-12]
 - ♦ After Jesus returned to Heaven, He will not return to earth again until the time for the Kingdom of Heaven to be established. [Acts 3:19-21]
 - ♦ At that time the Children of Israel will certainly say, "Blessed is He Who comes in the name of the Lord." [Matthew 23:39]
 - ♦ These are the same words for which the Pharisees had said to Jesus, "rebuke your disciples." [Luke 19:39]
