## Luke 9:43-45 Betrayal, Death, and Resurrection Predicted

<sup>43</sup> And they were all amazed at the majesty of God. But while everyone marveled at all the things which Jesus did, He said to His disciples, <sup>44</sup> Let these words sink down into your ears, for the Son of Man is about to be betrayed into the hands of men." <sup>45</sup> But they did not understand this saying, and it was hidden from them so that they did not perceive it; and they were afraid to ask Him about this saying. NKJV

## Facts Revealed:

- Jesus again predicted His betrayal, death, and resurrection. [Matthew 12:38-42, 16:21, 17:22-23, Mark 9:30-31, Luke 9:22, 43-45, 18:31-34, John 2:19-20, Acts 10:39-41]
- ✤ In God's plan, every detail is known before hand.
  - ☆ Jesus knew that He would suffer and be killed at the hands of the elders, chief priests, and scribes in Jerusalem, then He would be buried and raised on the third day. [Matthew 16:21]
  - ♦ Each detail in a prediction multiplies exponentially the improbability of it to happen by random chance.
  - Jesus predicted the place, the people who would perpetrate the deed, the suffering, the resultant death, and the duration of the time before the completion of the scenario the Resurrection, to be accomplished.
  - ☆ This many factors that all had to happen in order makes it almost impossible for anyone to guess ahead of time, indicating that God had to be the source of the revelation.
  - ♦ The scenario had not been predicted any time in the prophecies of the Old Covenant Scriptures.
  - ♦ Jesus had predicted His death, burial, and the time of His Resurrection in His comparison of the Sign of Jonah teaching. [Matthew 12:38-42, 16:4, Luke 11:29-32, 18:31-34]
- The disciples were exceedingly sorrowful, because they did not understand and they were afraid to ask. [Matthew 17:23, Mark 9:32, Luke 9:43-45, 18:31-34]
