Luke 9:57-62 Consider the Cost of Discipleship

57 Now it happened as they journeyed on the road, that someone said to Him, "Lord, I will follow You wherever You go."

⁵⁸ And Jesus said to him, "Foxes have holes and birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay His head."

⁵⁹ Then He said to another, "Follow Me." But he said, "Lord, let me first go and bury my father." ⁶⁰ Jesus said to him, "Let the dead bury their own dead, but you go and preach the kingdom of God."

⁶¹ And another also said, "Lord, I will follow You, but let me first go and bid them farewell who are at my house." ⁶² But Jesus said to him, "No one, having put his hand to the plow, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God." NKJV

Facts Revealed:

Considerations for Discipleship [Matthew 8:18-22, Luke 9:57-62]

- Command to cross the Sea of Galilee from Capernaum.
- ✤ A Scribe witnessed the power and authority of Jesus, and desired to go with Him, saying, "Lord, I will follow You wherever You go."
 - ♦ The answer Jesus gave was an indication that He did not have earthly possessions, and could not offer earthly comforts.
- The one who asked first to go bury his father, and the one who wanted to first return home to bid his family farewell, were procrastinating.
 - ♦ His father was not dead, but he wanted to wait till the time after his father had died and been buried before he would be willing to follow Jesus.
 - ♦ If his father had actually died, the man would have been with the family making arrangements for burial, and in mourning, not with the multitude around Jesus.
 - \diamond The other was just more connected with family than with Jesus and His ministry.
 - ♦ The answer Jesus gave indicated that to be a disciple of Jesus, we would be required to establish priorities and be willing to respond at the time of the call.
 - \diamond Following Jesus is much more important than procrastinating till a convenient time.
 - $\diamond\,$ There are plenty of unsaved to bury the unsaved.
- This concept goes very well with the teaching of Jesus, which says:

"No one, having put his hand to the plow, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God." [Luke 9:62]
