## Mark 14:3-9 Mary of Bethany Anointed Jesus

<sup>3</sup> And being in Bethany at the house of Simon the leper, as He sat at the table, a woman came having an alabaster flask of very costly oil of spikenard. Then she broke the flask and poured it on His head.

<sup>4</sup> But there were some who were indignant among themselves, and said, "Why was this fragrant oil wasted? <sup>5</sup> For it might have been sold for more than three hundred denarii and given to the poor." And they criticized her sharply.

<sup>6</sup> But Jesus said, "Let her alone. Why do you trouble her? She has done a good work for Me. <sup>7</sup> For you have the poor with you always, and whenever you wish you may do them good; but Me you do not have always.

8 She has done what she could. She has come beforehand to anoint My body for burial. 9 Assuredly, I say to you, wherever this gospel is preached in the whole world, what this woman has done will also be told as a memorial to her." NKJV

Facts Revealed:

- Jesus was anointed by Mary the sister of Martha, Lazarus, and Judas Iscariot, daughter of Simon the leper who was a Pharisee. [Matthew 26:6-13, Mark 14:3-9, Luke 7:36-50, John 12:1-8]
- One of the disciples, her brother Judas Iscariot criticized the waste. [Matthew 26:8-9, Mark 14:4-5, John 12:4-6]
  - ♦ Her father Simon said, "This man, if He were a prophet, would know who and what manner of woman this is who is touching Him, for she is a sinner." [Luke 7:39]
  - $\diamond$  This gives us a clue that Mary might have been a harlot.
- ♥ Jesus addressed her father Simon who was a Pharisee, saying:
  - Simon, I have something to say to you." And he said, "Teacher, say it." 41 There was a certain creditor who had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. 42 And when they had nothing with which to repay, he freely forgave them both. Tell Me, therefore, which of them will love him more?" 43 Simon answered and said, "I suppose the one whom he forgave more." And He said to him, "You have rightly judged." 44 Then He turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave Me no water for My feet, but she has washed My feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head. 45 You gave Me no kiss, but this woman has not ceased to kiss My feet since the time I came in. 46 You did not anoint My head with oil, but this woman has anointed My feet with fragrant oil. 47 Therefore I say to you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven, for she loved much. But to whom little is forgiven, the same loves little." [Luke 7:40-47] NKJV
- ✤ Jesus forgave Mary of her sins. [Luke 7:48]
  - Jesus had taught that repentant harlots might enter the Kingdom of Heaven, while Chief Priests, Elders, Scribes, and Pharisees might not be allowed in. [Matthew 5:20, 8:11-12, 21:31-32, 23:13]
- Jesus credited it as anointing for His burial. [Matthew 26:10-12, Mark 14:6-8, John 12:7]
- Jesus made this a memorial for Mary, wherever this Gospel is preached. [Matthew 26:13, Mark 14:9]
