# Mark 1:1-8 **Entry of John the Baptist**

<sup>1</sup> The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. <sup>2</sup> As it is written in the Prophets:

"Behold, I send My messenger before Your face,

Who will prepare Your way before You."

3 "The voice of one crying in the wilderness:

'Prepare the way of the LORD;

Make His paths straight.' "

### Ministry of John the Baptist

4 John came baptizing in the wilderness and preaching a baptism of repentance for the remission of sins.

# Response of the people

<sup>5</sup> And all the land of Judea, and those from Jerusalem, went out to him and were all baptized by him in the Jordan River, confessing their sins.

#### Attire of John the Baptist

6 Now John was clothed with camel's hair and with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey.

#### Representative of the One to come

<sup>7</sup> And he preached, saying, "There comes One after me who is mightier than I, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to stoop down and loose. <sup>8</sup> I indeed baptized you with water, but He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." NKJV

#### Facts Revealed:

- ₱ Mark presents Jesus as the servant without genealogy.
- The account begins when John begins his ministry to introduce Yehowah to the world. [Mark 1:1-3]

### Behold, I send My messenger,

#### And he will prepare the way before Me.

And Adoney (the Lord), whom you seek,

Will suddenly come to His temple,

Even the Messenger of the covenant,

In whom you delight.

Behold, He is coming,"

Says **Yehowah Tsebavta** (the LORD of hosts). [Malachi 3:1]

#### The voice of one crying in the wilderness:

"Prepare the way of Yehowah (the LORD);

Make straight in the desert A highway for Eloheynov (our God). [Isaiah 40:3]

♦ By quoting these particular prophecies, Mark is indicating that John the Baptist was the messenger of <u>Yehowah Tsebavta</u>, who would proceed <u>Adoney</u> whom the Jews are seeking, and prepare the way of <u>Yehowah Eloheynov</u>. These are all references to the God of Israel, names of God.

Ministry of John the Baptist

- † John was preaching in the wilderness like many of the prophets of old. [Mark 1:4, Luke 3:2-3]
  - ♦ John's food and clothing was like one of the prophets of old. [Mark 1:6]
  - ♦ John's message was baptism of <u>repentance</u> for the remission of sins, as was the common theme of the prophets of old. [Mark 1:4, Matthew 3:11, Luke 3:3, Acts 13:24, 19:4]

### Response of the people

- ♣ Looking at the evidence, the people counted John as a prophet. [Matthew 14:5, 16:14, 21:26, Mark 6:15]
  - ❖ From all the land of Judea and from Jerusalem people went out to John and were baptized by him in the Jordan River, confessing their sins. [Mark 1:5, Matthew 3:5-6]

# Representative of the One to come

- ♣ John introduced the One to Come by saying:
  - "There comes One after me who is mightier than I, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to stoop down and loose. I indeed baptized you with water, but He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." [Mark 12:7-8, Matthew 3:11, Luke 3:16, John 1:33, Acts 1:5, 11:16]
  - → John is a faithful servant with a mission to perform as directed by God before the start of his ministry. [Luke 3:2]
  - ♦ John was a humble man who felt himself unworthy to even loosen a strap of the sandal worn by Jesus.
  - ♦ John called people to repentance and baptized them with water.
  - ♦ The One coming after John is much mightier than John, and it is He Who will baptize you with the Holy Spirit.
    - ☐ The Baptism of the Holy Spirit is the source of enabling for our understanding as He opens the truths of Scriptures in our minds [John 14:26, 16:13-14]
    - □ And for the gifts and ministries of the Holy Spirit as He empowers and emboldens the Saints for the work of the ministry of the Gospel. [Luke 24:49, Acts 1:5, 2:1-47, 4:1-31]
