James and John the sons of Zebedee were called Boanerges, that is, "Sons of Thunder" [Mark 3:17]

- Thaddaeus was the surname of Lebbaeus. [Matthew 10:3]
- Simon is called the Canaanite, the Cananite, the Cananaean, and the Zealot depending on the translation and the choice of the translators.
 - ♦ Canaanite would suggest a descendant of the original race who inhabited the land before Israel was given it as an inheritance.
 - ☆ Cananite or Cananaean would suggest a person from the city of Canan, or the name of a political party. There is also a city of Cana. [John 2:1]

 - ♦ The Greek word being translated is Kananites or Kananaíos depending on the Greek version being translated.
