Nehemiah 7:73-8:18 Ezra Read the Law - Feast of Tabernacles Observed

Ezra Reads the Law

When the seventh month came, the children of Israel were in their cities.

- Now all the people gathered together as one man in the open square that was in front of the Water Gate; and they told Ezra the scribe to bring the Book of the Law of Moses, which Yahweh (the Lord) had commanded Israel.
- ² So Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly of men and women and all who could hear with understanding on the first day of the seventh month.
- ³ Then he read from it in the open square that was in front of the Water Gate from morning until midday, before the men and women and those who could understand; and the ears of all the people were attentive to the Book of the Law.
- ⁴ So Ezra the scribe stood on a platform of wood which they had made for the purpose; and beside him, at his right hand, stood Mattithiah, Shema, Anaiah, Urijah, Hilkiah, and Maaseiah; and at his left hand Pedaiah, Mishael, Malchijah, Hashum, Hashbadana, Zechariah, and Meshullam.
- ⁵ And Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people, for he was standing above all the people; and when he opened it, all the people stood up.
- ⁶ And Ezra blessed Yahweh Elohiym (the Lord, the great God).

Then all the people answered, "Amen, Amen!" while lifting up their hands. And they bowed their heads and worshiped Yahweh (the Lord) with their faces to the ground.

- ⁷ Also Jeshua, Bani, Sherebiah, Jamin, Akkub, Shabbethai, Hodijah, Maaseiah, Kelita, Azariah, Jozabad, Hanan, Pelaiah, and the Levites, helped the people to understand the Law; and the people stood in their place.
- 8 So they read distinctly from the book, in the Law of Elohiym (God); and they gave the sense, and helped them to understand the reading.
- 9 And Nehemiah, who was the governor, Ezra the priest and scribe, and the Levites who taught the people said to all the people, "This day is holy to Yahweh Eloheykem (the Lord your God); do not mourn nor weep." For all the people wept, when they heard

Eloheykem (the Lord your God); do not mourn nor weep." For all the people wept, when they heard the words of the Law.

- 10 Then he said to them, "Go your way, eat the fat, drink the sweet, and send portions to those for whom nothing is prepared; for this day is holy to Adoneynu our Lord. Do not sorrow, for the joy of Yahweh (the Lord) is your strength."
- 11 So the Levites quieted all the people, saying, "Be still, for the day is holy; do not be grieved."
- 12 And all the people went their way to eat and drink, to send portions and rejoice greatly, because they understood the words that were declared to them.

The Feast of Tabernacles (cf. Leviticus 23:33-43)

- 13 Now on the second day the heads of the fathers' houses of all the people, with the priests and Levites, were gathered to Ezra the scribe, in order to understand the words of the Law.
- 14 And they found written in the Law, which Yahweh (the Lord) had commanded by Moses, that the children of Israel should dwell in booths during the feast of the seventh month,
- 15 and that they should announce and proclaim in all their cities and in Jerusalem, saying, "Go out to

the mountain, and bring olive branches, branches of oil trees, myrtle branches, palm branches, and branches of leafy trees, to make booths, as it is written."

- 16 Then the people went out and brought them and made themselves booths, each one on the roof of his house, or in their courtyards or the courts of Beit Elohiym (the house of God), and in the open square of the Water Gate and in the open square of the Gate of Ephraim.
- 17 So the whole assembly of those who had returned from the captivity made booths and sat under the booths; for since the days of Joshua the son of Nun until that day the children of Israel had not done so. And there was very great gladness.
- 18 Also day by day, from the first day until the last day, he read from the Book of the Law of Elohiym (God). And they kept the feast seven days; and on the eighth day there was a sacred assembly, according to the prescribed manner.

Facts Revealed:

Ezra Read the Law

- ♦ When the seventh month came, the children of Israel were in their cities. [Nehemiah 7:73]
- ☼ In the seventh month, in the open square in front of the Water Gate, all the people gathered as one man and Ezra the priest read from the Book of the Law of Moses which Yahweh had commanded. [Nehemiah 8:1]
- ★ The Law was read to the assembly of men, women, and all who could hear with understanding on the first day of the seventh month, the ears of the people were attentive. [Nehemiah 8:2-3]
- ★ Ezra stood on a raised wooden platform with the leaders of Israel standing on his right hand and on his left. When he opened the book of the Law the people stood up. Ezra blessed Yahweh Elohiym and the people answered "Amen! Amen! with their hands lifted up and their heads bowed. [Nehemiah 8:4-6]
- ➡ Nehemiah was the governor, Ezra the Priest and Scribe, Officials and the Levites stood among the people and helped the people to understand the Law. They charged the people not to mourn or weep because the day is Holy to Yahweh. [Nehemiah 8:7-11]
- And all the people went their way to eat and drink, to send portions and rejoice greatly, because they understood the words that were declared to them. [Nehemiah 8:12]

The Feast of Tabernacles (cf. Leviticus 23:33-43)

- ☼ Reading the Law they found the instructions concerning the Feast of Tabernacles in the seventh month as commanded by Moses, and did according to the command with great gladness. [Nehemiah 8:13-19]
- Also day by day, from the first day until the last day, he read from the Book of the Law of Elohiym (God). And they kept the feast seven days; and on the eighth day there was a sacred assembly, according to the prescribed manner. [Nehemiah 8:18]
