Wisdom Loves Righteousness

¹·A wise son *heeds* his father's instruction, But a scoffer does not listen to rebuke.

² A man shall eat well by the fruit of *his* mouth, But the soul of the unfaithful feeds on violence.

³ He who guards his mouth preserves his life, *But* he who opens wide his lips shall have destruction.

⁴ The soul of a lazy *man* desires, and *has* nothing; But the soul of the diligent shall be made rich.

⁵ A righteous *man* hates lying, But a wicked *man* is loathsome and comes to shame.

⁶ Righteousness guards *him whose* way is blameless, But wickedness overthrows the sinner.

⁷ There is one who makes himself rich, yet *has* nothing; *And* one who makes himself poor, yet *has* great riches.

⁸ The ransom of a man's life *is* his riches, But the poor does not hear rebuke.

⁹ The light of the righteous rejoices, But the lamp of the wicked will be put out.

¹⁰ By pride comes nothing but strife, But with the well-advised *is* wisdom.

¹¹ Wealth *gained by* dishonesty will be diminished, But he who gathers by labor will increase.

¹² Hope deferred makes the heart sick,But when the desire comes, *it is* a tree of life.

¹³ He who despises the word will be destroyed,But he who fears the commandment will be rewarded.

¹⁴ The law of the wise *is* a fountain of life, To turn *one* away from the snares of death. ¹⁵ Good understanding gains favor, But the way of the unfaithful *is* hard.

¹⁶ Every prudent *man* acts with knowledge, But a fool lays open *his* folly.

¹⁷ A wicked messenger falls into trouble, But a faithful ambassador *brings* health.
