The Beginning of Knowledge

- ^{1.}The proverbs of Solomon the son of David, king of Israel:
- ² To know wisdom and instruction, To perceive the words of understanding,
- ³ To receive the instruction of wisdom, Justice, judgment, and equity;
- ⁴ To give prudence to the simple, To the young man knowledge and discretion –
- ⁵ A wise *man* will hear and increase learning, And a man of understanding will attain wise counsel,
- ⁶ To understand a proverb and an enigma, The words of the wise and their riddles.
- ⁷ The fear of Yahweh (the LORD) *is* the beginning of knowledge, *But* fools despise wisdom and instruction.

 - ♦ Identity of the writer of the Proverbs.
- To know wisdom and instruction, To perceive the words of understanding,
 To receive the instruction of wisdom, Justice, judgment, and equity;
 To give prudence to the simple, To the young man knowledge and discretion [Proverbs 1:2-4]
 - ❖ The purpose of the Proverbs is to impart wisdom, instruction, perception, and understanding.
 - ♦ These include justice, judgment, and equity (fairness).
 - ♦ To the simple (humble) it provides prudence (caution, carefulness).
 - ♦ For the young it provides knowledge and discretion (good judgment).
- ☆ A wise man will hear and increase learning, And a man of understanding will attain
 wise counsel,

To understand a proverb and an enigma, The words of the wise and their riddles. [Proverbs 1:5-6]

- ♦ A wise man is described as one who will listen to instruction and increase in learning.
- ♦ A man of understanding will attain (achieve) wise counsel.
- ♦ He will understand a proverb and an enigma (riddle), the words of the wise and their riddles.
- ♦ The proverb encourages the hearer to show diligence (attentiveness) to the words of the wise that they may gain knowledge and discern the understanding of their proverbs and riddles.
- ☆ The fear of Yahweh (the LORD) is the beginning of knowledge,

But fools despise wisdom and instruction. [Proverbs 1:7]

- ♦ Knowledge begins with the fear of Yahweh and it grows by careful study of Holy Scriptures.
- ❖ In contrast, the fools despise wisdom and instruction refusing Scripture study which would give them knowledge of Yehowah.
