- <sup>1.</sup>The words of King Lemuel, the utterance which his mother taught him:
- <sup>2</sup> What, my son? And what, son of my womb? And what, son of my vows?
- <sup>3</sup> Do not give your strength to women, Nor your ways to that which destroys kings.
- <sup>4</sup> It is not for kings, O Lemuel, It is not for kings to drink wine, Nor for princes intoxicating drink;
- <sup>5</sup> Lest they drink and forget the law, And pervert the justice of all the afflicted.
- <sup>6</sup> Give strong drink to him who is perishing, And wine to those who are bitter of heart.
- <sup>7</sup> Let him drink and forget his poverty, And remember his misery no more.
- 8 Open your mouth for the speechless, In the cause of all who are appointed to die.\*
- <sup>9</sup> Open your mouth, judge righteously, And plead the cause of the poor and needy.
