With Your hand from men, O Yahweh (Lord), From men of the world who have their portion in this life, And whose belly You fill with Your hidden treasure. They are satisfied with children, And leave the rest of their possession for their babes. [Psalm 17:13-14]

- ♦ David calls for Yahweh to deliver him from his wicked enemies.
- ♦ Yahweh may use His Sword which is the Word of God (Ephesians 6:17, Hebrews 4:12)
- ♦ He may also use the hand of men whose portion is in this life to deliver David.
- ♦ Yahweh has filled them with hidden treasure, they are satisfied with children and leave their possessions for their babes.
- ❖ As for me, I will see Your face in righteousness; I shall be satisfied when I awake in Your likeness. [Psalm 17:15]
