To the Chief Musician. A Psalm of the sons of Korah.

^{1.}Hear this, all peoples; Give ear, all inhabitants of the world,

² Both low and high, Rich and poor together.

³ My mouth shall speak wisdom, And the meditation of my heart *shall give* understanding.

⁴I will incline my ear to a proverb; I will disclose my dark saying on the harp.

- ☆ There is no reason for the righteous to fear when surrounded by foolish self centered selfabsorbed people.
- \diamond They trust in their wealth and boast of their riches.
- \diamond They do not consider their latter end or that they will die and leave their wealth to others.
- \diamond Even a man in honor will die as do the beasts.
- \diamond Redemption of the soul is costly and the wealth of the rich cannot buy it.
- ♦ Only the blood of Messiah can purchase our redemption. [Ephesians 1:7, Colossians 1:13-14]
- ☆ Like sheep they are laid in the grave; Death shall feed on them;

The upright shall have dominion over them in the morning; And their beauty shall be consumed in the grave, far from their dwelling.

But Elohiym (God) will redeem my soul from the power of the grave, For He shall receive me. [Psalm 49:14-15]

- \diamond The self focused people are compared to sheep who die and decay in the grave.
- \diamond The upright will have dominion over them on the day of judgment.

 \diamond But the writer has confidence that Elohiym will redeem his soul and receive him.

Do not be afraid when one becomes rich, When the glory of his house is increased; For when he dies he shall carry nothing away; His glory shall not descend after him. Though while he lives he blesses himself (For *men* will praise you when you do well for yourself),

He shall go to the generation of his fathers; They shall never see light. A man *who is* in honor, yet does not understand, Is like the beasts *that* perish. [Psalm 49:16-20]

- \diamond Do not envy a self-absorbed people because when he dies he takes nothing with him.
- \diamond He shall perish and join all those who were before him on the day of judgment.
