For it is not an enemy who reproaches me; Then I could bear it. Nor is it one who hates me who has exalted himself against me; Then I could hide from him. But it was you, a man my equal, My companion and my acquaintance.

We took sweet counsel together, And walked to Beit Elohiym (the house of God) in the throng.

Let death seize them; Let them go down alive into hell, For wickedness *is* in their dwellings *and* among them. [Psalm 55:12-15]

 \diamond The anguish is not so much for the enemy but the fact that it is coming from a friend.

- \diamond David called for judgment against the oppressors.
- As for me, I will call upon Elohiym (God), And Yahweh (the LORD) shall save me. Evening and morning and at noon I will pray, and cry aloud, And He shall hear my voice.

He has redeemed my soul in peace from the battle *that was* against me, For there were many against me.

El (God) will hear, and afflict them, Even He who abides from of old. [Psalm 55:16-19] ♦ David expressed his confidence in Yahweh to save him afflict the wicked. Because they do not change, Therefore they do not fear Elohiym (God).

- \diamond The problem with the oppressors is that they do not fear Elohiym.
- \diamond The error of the oppressors is their broken covenant and hypocritical words.
- Cast your burden on Yahweh (the LORD), And He shall sustain you; He shall never permit the righteous to be moved.

But You, O Elohiym (God), shall bring them down to the pit of destruction; Bloodthirsty and deceitful men shall not live out half their days; But I will trust in You. [Psalm 55:22-23]

- \diamond David advised the righteous to trust in Yahweh.
- ♦ David acknowledged that Elohiym will fully repay the wicked.
- \diamond David will trust in Yahweh.
