Psalm 73:1-28 Grieved by the prosperity of the wicked – Comforted by prospect of their end

The Tragedy of the Wicked, and the Blessedness of Trust in God

A Psalm of Asaph.

- 1. Truly Elohiym (God) is good to Israel, To such as are pure in heart.
- ² But as for me, my feet had almost stumbled; My steps had nearly slipped.
- ³ For I was envious of the boastful, When I saw the prosperity of the wicked.
- ⁴ For there are no pangs in their death, But their strength is firm.
- ⁵ They are not in trouble as other men, Nor are they plagued like other men.
- ⁶ Therefore pride serves as their necklace; Violence covers them *like* a garment.
- ⁷ Their eyes bulge* with abundance; They have more than heart could wish.
- ⁸ They scoff and speak wickedly concerning oppression; They speak loftily.
- ⁹ They set their mouth against the heavens, And their tongue walks through the earth.
- ¹⁰ Therefore his people return here, And waters of a full *cup* are drained by them.
- 11 And they say, "How does El (God) know? And is there knowledge in the Most High?"
- ¹² Behold, these *are* the ungodly, Who are always at ease; They increase *in* riches.
- ¹³ Surely I have cleansed my heart *in* vain, And washed my hands in innocence.
- ¹⁴ For all day long I have been plagued, And chastened every morning.
- ¹⁵ If I had said, "I will speak thus," Behold, I would have been untrue to the generation of Your children.
- ¹⁶ When I thought how to understand this, It was too painful for me —
- ¹⁷ Until I went into the sanctuary of El (God); Then I understood their end.
- ¹⁸ Surely You set them in slippery places; You cast them down to destruction.
- ¹⁹ Oh, how they are *brought* to desolation, as in a moment! They are utterly consumed with terrors
- ²⁰ As a dream when *one* awakes, *So,* Adonay (Lord), when You awake, You shall despise their image.
- ²¹ Thus my heart was grieved, And I was vexed in my mind.
- ²² I was so foolish and ignorant; I was like a beast before You.
- ²³ Nevertheless I am continually with You; You hold me by my right hand.
- ²⁴ You will guide me with Your counsel, And afterward receive me to glory.
- ²⁵ Whom have I in heaven but You? And there is none upon earth that I desire besides You.
- ²⁶ My flesh and my heart fail; *But* Elohiym (God) *is* the strength of my heart and my portion forever.
- ²⁷ For indeed, those who are far from You shall perish; You have destroyed all those who desert You for harlotry.
- ²⁸ But *it is* good for me to draw near to Elohiym (God); I have put my trust in Adonay Yahweh (the Lord God), That I may declare all Your works.

Facts Revealed:

- ☆ Truly Elohiym (God) is good to Israel, To such as are pure in heart. [Psalm 73:1]
 - ♦ Asaph and his sons were appointed by David and the leaders of the Levites to lead the music with song and musical instruments in worship services of Elohiym. [1 Chronicles 15:16-22]
 - ♦ Asaph was descended from Gershon the son of Levi. [Genesis 46:11, 1 Chronicles 6:39-43]
 - ♦ Part of the ministry of Asaph included prophesy. [1 Chronicles 25:1-2]
 - ♦ Asaph observed that Elohiym is good to Israel especially to those with a pure heart.

 - ♦ Reasons why Asaph was envious of the prosperity of the wicked.
- Surely I have cleansed my heart in vain, And washed my hands in innocence.
 For all day long I have been plagued, And chastened every morning.
 If I had said, "I will speak thus," Behold, I would have been untrue to the generation of Your children. [Psalm 73:13-15]
 - ♦ Considering the ease of the wicked Asaph felt it was futile to remain pure for El.
- ★ When I thought how to understand this, It was too painful for me Until I went into the sanctuary of El (God); Then I understood their end. Surely You set them in slippery places; You cast them down to destruction. Oh, how they are brought to desolation, as in a moment! They are utterly consumed with terrors.

As a dream when *one* awakes, *So*, Adonay (Lord), when You awake, You shall despise their image. [Psalm 73:16-20]

- ♦ Asaph's envy continued until he went into the Sanctuary of El.
- ♦ There he considered the expected end of the wicked on Judgment Day.
- Thus my heart was grieved, And I was vexed in my mind.

 I was so foolish and ignorant; I was like a beast before You.

 Nevertheless I am continually with You; You hold me by my right hand.

 You will guide me with Your counsel, And afterward receive me to glory.

 Whom have I in heaven but You? And there is none upon earth that I desire besides You.

 My flesh and my heart fail; But Elohiym (God) is the strength of my heart and my portion forever. [Psalm 73:21-26]
 - ♦ Asaph realized that his envy was foolishness like a beast before Elohiym.
 - ♦ He remembered that Elohiym was with him and his guide Who would receive him to Glory

- ♦ Then he acknowledged that Elohiym is his only true desire and hope on earth and in Heaven.
- ♦ Elohiym is the strength of my heart and He is my only eternal portion.
- For indeed, those who are far from You shall perish; You have destroyed all those who desert You for harlotry. [Psalm 73:27]
- ⇔ But it is good for me to draw near to Elohiym (God); I have put my trust in Adonay Yahweh (the Lord God), That I may declare all Your works. [Psalm 73:28]
