#### Observations Revealed:

#### THE SHULAMITE\*

- ☆ The song of songs, which is Solomon's. [Song of Songs 1:1]
  - → The writer is clearly identified as Solomon.
  - ♦ The word Shulamite refers to the bride of Solomon or "Daughter of Peace" as Solomon is called the "Prince of Peace".

- ♦ Many believe it to be Abishag a Shunammite from the city of Shunem, the beautiful young woman brought to David to keep him warm in his old age for whom Solomon killed his brother Adonijah. [1 Kings 1:1-4, 2:13-25]
- ♦ Also, Shunem was the city in the land of Issachar where Elisha raised the Shunammite's son. [Joshua 19:17-18, 2 Kings 4:8-37,
- ↓ Let him kiss me with the kisses of his mouth For your\* love is better than wine. Because of the fragrance of your good ointments, Your name is ointment poured forth;

Therefore the virgins love you.

Draw me away! [Song of Songs 1:2-4]

- ♦ The bride is longing for intimacy with her lover.
- ♦ The Shulamite also realizes the attraction the virgins feel toward him.
- ♦ Elohiym created the woman and gave her a special desire for her man. [Genesis 3:16]
- → This is a reflection of the desire for intimacy the Saints holds for Christ, longing for the closest possible relationship with our loving Lord.
- ♦ The Saints are also aware of the longing of the world around them and are sent to call all to repentance that they may also know the same love for the Lord.
- ♦ It is not a jealous realization, but an honest shared yearning.
- ♦ The Saints are the fragrance of Christ to the world before God. [2 Corinthians 2:14-15]

- ☆ We will run after you.\* [Song of Songs 1:4]
  - ♦ Those who are open to the call will joyfully join the Church in her pursuit of the Savior.

  - ♦ The bride is with her lover in his chamber.

  [Song of Songs 1:4]
  - ♦ The Church remembers the love of God who sent His Savior into the world to redeem us from our sins. [John 3 16]

## THE SHULAMITE

- ☆ Rightly do they love you.\*
  - ♦ It is a right thing for all who will, to love the Savior.
- □ I am dark, but lovely, O daughters of Jerusalem, Like the tents of Kedar, Like the curtains of Solomon.

Do not look upon me, because I am dark, Because the sun has tanned me.

My mother's sons were angry with me; They made me the keeper of the vineyards, But my own vineyard I have not kept. [Song of Songs 1:5-6]

- ♦ The Shulamite describes herself as darkened by the sun from working in the fields of her mother's sons who were angry (jealous) of her comeliness.
- ♦ She was lovely in appearance and characteristic as was required in the search for one to warm and care for David in his old age. [1 Kings 1:1-4]
- ♦ The Church was dark with sin but greatly desired by God who provided a way to make her pure and lovely by the precious blood of our Lord Jesus for all who believe and repent.

# (To Her Beloved)

★ Tell me, O you whom I love, Where you feed your flock, Where you make it rest at noon.

For why should I be as one who veils herself\* By the flocks of your companions? [Song of Songs 1:7]

- ♦ The king is the shepherd of Israel and responsible for their guidance and care.
- ♦ The Lord is the Good Shepherd of the Church.
- ♦ Women with veils were harlots. [Genesis 38:14]
- ♦ The Shulamite does not want to appear as a harlot in the eyes of the world.

### THE BELOVED

❖ If you do not know, O fairest among women, Follow in the footsteps of the flock, And feed your little goats Beside the shepherds' tents.

I have compared you, my love, To my filly among Pharaoh's chariots. Your cheeks are lovely with ornaments, Your neck with chains *of gold*. [Song of Songs 1:8-10]

- ♦ Solomon called her the fairest among women.
- ♦ Peter speaks of the beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit which is precious in the sight of God. [1 peter 3:4]
- ♦ The flock follows the shepherd, so following the flock will certainly show the way to him. [John 10:1-5]
- ❖ In the presence of the shepherd, she can properly care for those in her custody.
- ❖ Solomon compares her beauty with that of his choice ornate chariot horses many of which came from Egypt.

- ☼ We will make you\* ornaments of gold With studs of silver. [Song of Songs 1:11]
  - ♦ The ladies of the court promise to make ornaments for the wedding attire of the bride.
  - ♦ In Revelation we find the Bride of The Lamb arrayed in fine linen which is the righteous acts
    of the Saints. [Revelation 19:8]

## THE SHULAMITE

- ★ While the king is at his table, My spikenard sends forth its fragrance.

  A bundle of myrrh is my beloved to me, That lies all night between my breasts.

  My beloved is to me a cluster of henna blooms In the vineyards of En Gedi. [Song of Songs 1:12-14]
  - ♦ At the king's banquet, the spikenard (perfume) of the bride sends forth its fragrance.
  - ♦ The Shulamite compared the fragrance of the king to the aroma of myrrh which she places between her breasts at night and to the fragrance of henna in the vineyards of En Gedi.

#### THE BELOVED

- ★ Behold, you are fair, my love! Behold, you are fair! You have dove's eyes. [Song of Songs 1:15]
  - ♦ Solomon is enraptured by the beauty of the bride and her eyes.
  - ♦ Dove's eyes speak of gentle innocence, a quality of the Holy Spirit in the life of the bride.

# THE SHULAMITE

⇔ Behold, you are handsome, my beloved! Yes, pleasant!
 Also our bed is green.

The beams of our houses are cedar, And our rafters of fir. [Song of Songs 1:16-17]

- ♦ The Shulamite is well pleased with her beloved in his appearance and personality.
- ♦ The green bed speaks of life and purity.
- ♦ There is an emerald rainbow around the Throne of God. [Revelation 4:2-4]
- ♦ The beams and rafters speak of their covering and protection.
- ♦ Peter said, love covers a multitude of sins. [1 Peter 4:8]
