#### Observations Revealed:

- $\diamond$  On her bed at night, she reached out for her beloved but he was gone.
- $\diamond$  She sought him in the house but did not find him.
- $\diamond$  She went out into the city streets and squares seeking him but did not find him.
- $\diamond$  The city watchmen found her and she asked them if they had seen him but they had not.
- $\diamond$  Shortly after she left the watchmen she found her beloved.
- ♦ She held him and would not let him go until she brought him to her mother's house and into the chamber where she had been conceived.
- $\diamond$  Love was so precious to her, she again cautioned the daughters of Jerusalem to not stir up or awaken love until its proper time and setting.

# The Coming of Solomon

Who is this coming out of the wilderness Like pillars of smoke, Perfumed with myrrh and frankincense, With all the merchant's fragrant powders?

Behold, it is Solomon's couch (*palanquin* - an enclosed chair or lounge-chair for bearing one person, carried between horizontal poles by two or more porters), With sixty valiant men around it, Of the valiant of Israel.

They all hold swords, *Being* expert in war. Every man *has* his sword on his thigh Because of fear in the night.

Of the wood of Lebanon Solomon the King Made himself a palanquin:\*

He made its pillars of silver, Its support of gold, Its seat of purple, Its interior paved with love By the daughters of Jerusalem. [Song of Solomon 3:6-10]

- ♦ Solomon, greatly perfumed, is riding out of the wilderness on a palanquin he had made for himself out of wood from Lebanon with pillars of silver and its support of gold.
- $\diamond$  Out of love for him the daughters of Jerusalem had made its seat and interior of purple.
- ♦ Because of fear of the night he had a guard of sixty valiant men of Israel being expert in war, each with his sword on his thigh.
- Go forth, O daughters of Zion, And see King Solomon with the crown With which his mother crowned him On the day of his wedding, The day of the gladness of his heart. [Song of Solomon 3:11]
  - ☆ The Shulamite invites the daughters of Zion to go out to see Solomon as he enters Jerusalem wearing the crown his mother placed on his head on his wedding day.
