Praise of the Shulamite's Beauty

THE BELOVED

- ⁴O my love, you *are as* beautiful as Tirzah, Lovely as Jerusalem, Awesome as *an army* with banners!
- ⁵ Turn your eyes away from me, For they have overcome me. Your hair *is* like a flock of goats Going down from Gilead.
- ⁶ Your teeth *are* like a flock of sheep Which have come up from the washing; Every one bears twins, And none *is* barren among them.
- ⁷ Like a piece of pomegranate *Are* your temples behind your veil.
- ⁸ There are sixty queens And eighty concubines, And virgins without number.
- ⁹ My dove, my perfect one, Is the only one, The only one of her mother, The favorite of the one who bore her.
- The daughters saw her And called her blessed, The queens and the concubines, And they praised her.

- ♦ Where has your beloved gone, O fairest among women?
 - Where has your beloved turned aside, That we may seek him with you? [Song of Solomon 6:1]
 - ♦ The Shulamite had asked the Daughters of Jerusalem to take a message to her beloved if they find him. [Song of Solomon 5:8]
 - ♦ They ask her where to focus their search.
- ★ My beloved has gone to his garden, To the beds of spices, To feed his flock in the gardens, And to gather lilies.

I am my beloved's, And my beloved is mine.

He feeds his flock among the lilies. [Song of Solomon 6:2-3]

- ♦ The Shulamite had likened herself as a lily of the field. [Song of Solomon 2:1]
- ♦ Solomon had likened her to a lily among thorns as compared to other women. [Song of Solomon 2:2]
- ♦ She quickly clamed a solitary bond with her lover. (I am my beloved's and he is mine).
- ♦ Though he feeds his flock among the lilies of the field.

- ♦ Solomon had gone down to the valley to view the development of the fruit there.
- → He envisioned himself among the chariots of Israel.

- Return, return, O Shulamite; Return, return, that we may look upon you! [Song of Solomon 6:13]
 - ♦ Solomon and his friends desire to look upon the beauty of the Shulamite.

THE SHULAMITE

- ★ What would you see in the Shulamite As it were, the dance of the two camps?* [Song of Solomon 6:13]
 - ♦ She asked what they wanted to see in her, the dance of the two camps? A reference to the two camps when Jacob met the host of angels and called the place Mahanaim (two camps) [Genesis 32:1-2]
